Contrasting themes on display

Fall River—From the lighthouses of coastal New England to the faces of Central America, "A Coastal & A Distant Lens" will exhibit the work of two photographers at the Cherry and Webb Gallery from today to April 12.

Photographers Henry Krauzyk and Thomas Wilusz are both exhibiting their work for the first time in a joint show, according to gallery director Victoria Mathieson.

"Their work compliments each other," Mathieson said.

Wilusz' work was photographed in Kenya, Peru and Ecuador. "They are predominantly portraits," Mathieson said. "Even his animals are portraits.

"They're very, very colorful images. It is a lively contrast with the calm, serene landscapes" portrayed in Krauzyk's work, she said. "They're beautiful. This is going to be a very nice show."

This segment of Krauzyk's Coastal New England series is titled "Nantucket."

"I want to capture a comprehensive record of our region from southern Connecticut to the Maine/Canada border," said Krauzyk of Fall River, who is also a painter and a creative director for a company in Newton.

He has done previous work in the Azores with a black and white series in 2003.



Krauzyk said he plans to continue his passion for photographing New England, with Martha's Vineyard and Cape Cod planned for spring and summer.

"We live in a very beautiful part of the country," Krauzyk said. "Most of us take that for granted."

Wilusz, a Fall River native, said his photography career started a few years ago with a "work-related trip to the Pacific Northwest" and a Pentax camera, and it evolved into a passion for travel and sharing (those) experiences through a lens."

He has since gone on photo shoots to Alaska, Hawaii, the desert Southwest, Ireland, Scotland, Peru, Costa Rica, Kenya, Tanzania, Ecuador and the Galapagos Islands.

"A Coastal & A Distant Lens" will be on exhibit through April 12. The Cherry and Webb Gallery is located on 139 S. Main St. Gallery hours are Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., and Saturday, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.
